

FAFSA Checklist: Everything You Need to Complete the Form

Complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) at studentaid.gov to apply for federal, state and college-based financial aid.

Dependent students must include parents' information on the FAFSA. To determine your dependency status, answer the questions on the next page.

FAFSA APPLICATION DEPENDENCY STATUS QUESTIONS

Answer the following questions to determine your dependency status for the FAFSA.

| □Yes □No | Are you age 24 or older? |
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| □Yes □No | Are you married? |
| □Yes □No | Will you be working on a master's or doctorate program at the beginning of the school year for which you are applying for aid? |
| □Yes □No | Are you a veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces or currently serving on active duty? |
| □Yes □No | Do you now have, or will you have, children who will receive more than half of their support from you during the school year for which you are applying for aid? |
| □Yes □No | Do you have any dependents (other than a child or spouse) who live with you and who receive more than half of their support from you? |
| □Yes □No | At any time since you turned age 13, were both your parents deceased, were you in foster care, or were you a dependent or ward of the court? |
| □Yes □No | Are you or were you an emancipated minor as determined by a court in your state of legal residence? |
| □Yes □No | Does someone other than your parent or stepparent have legal guardianship of you, as determined by a court in your state of legal residence? |
| □Yes □No | At any time on or after July 1st of the previous year, did your high school or school district homeless liaison determine that you were an unaccompanied youth who was homeless? |
| □Yes □No | At any time on or after July 1st of the previous year, did the director of an emergency shelter or transitional housing program funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development determine that you were an unaccompanied youth who was homeless? |
| □Yes □No | At any time on or after July 1st of the previous year, did the director of a runaway or homeless youth basic center or transitional living program determine that you were an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or were self-supporting and at risk of being homeless? |

If you answer "no" to every question, you are dependent and must provide parental information on the FAFSA.

If you answer "yes" to any question, you are independent and should not include parental information on the FAFSA.
